Praise abounded for all involved with Los Mesteños Career Academy's (LMCA) seventh annual summer work training program, which is jointly sponsored by Brooks County Independent School District (BCISD), the Craft Training Center of the Coastal Bend, and Workforce Solutions. Juan Galvan, LMCA instructor, congratulated not only the student participants for their accomplishments, but also their parents for being an essential part of the process.
